

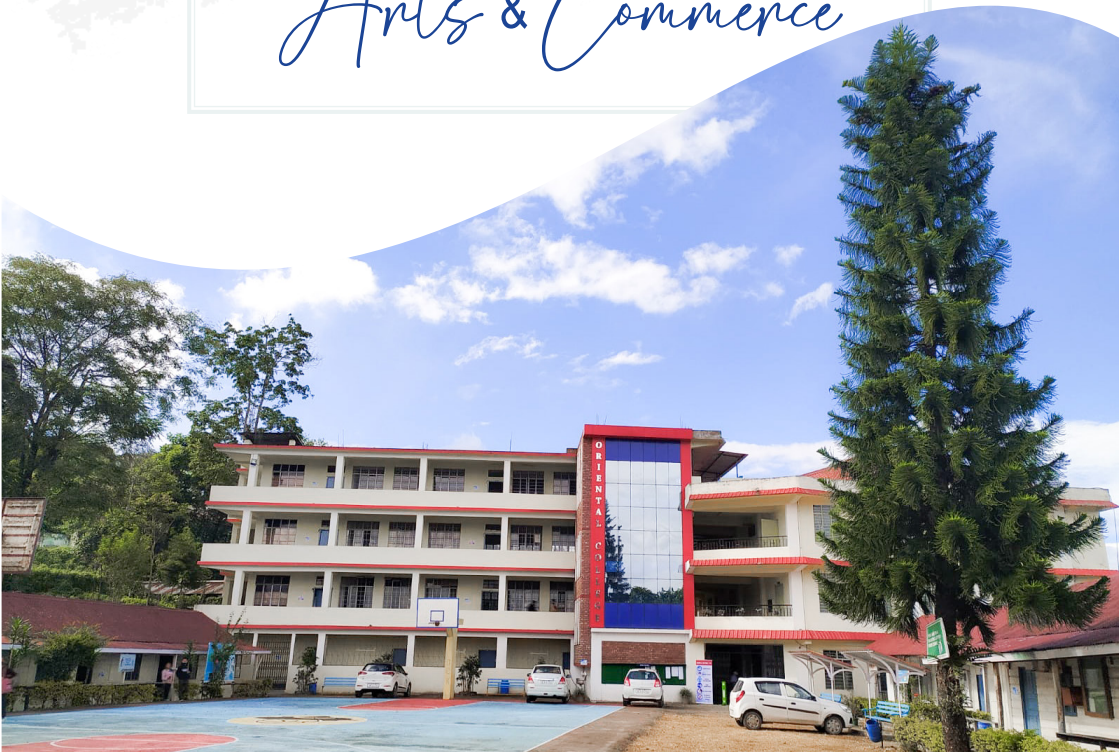

# Profile of the College

Oriental College, Kohima is a private institution, established in 1996 by a group of enthusiastic, energetic men under the auspices of the Christian Youth Organization of Christian Revival Church, Kohima Village. Christian Youth Organisation is registered under Registration of Societies Act, 1969 and numbered as H/RS-4958 dated 25<sup>th</sup> January 2008. The University Grants Commission have granted recognition to the college under section 2(f) and 12(b) of the UGC Act, 1956 on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2011. The College is a sprawling, scenic and serene institution catering to the needs and demands of higher education in Nagaland. The campus spreads over a vast stretch of land measuring about 4.74 acres and is located below the East Circular Road about 1.4 Km from the main city Kohima.

The college provide life skill and personality development and skill development training to inculcate life- value and upgrade skills and talents to prepare the student's for a holistic development of their future.

The College has a library, computer laboratory, recreation facilities like Gymnasium, Indoor Stadium for Badminton, Table Tennis & Day Care Centre . Highly qualified faculties with much experience in teaching are committed not only in helping the students in their academic pursuit but also, mentor them in shaping their future.

# ADMISSION

A candidate seeking admission to any of the courses must possess the required qualification from the recognized School or College. The Application form will be available along with the prospectus from the College Office on payment of Rs.500/- (Five hundred)

## PROCEDURE

- Registration can be done online from website :[www.orientalcollegekohima.in/](http://www.orientalcollegekohima.in/) WhatsApp link or offline mode from the college office.
- To avail free admission and concession registration is mandatory.
- Admission will be on 'first come first serve basis'.
- Registration and prospectus fee will be Rs. 500/-.

## ADMISSION OFFER

- **Free admission from 1<sup>st</sup> June to 5<sup>th</sup> June 2022.**
- Free hostel admission for the first 20 boys and 20 girls only.
- 50% concession from 6<sup>th</sup> June to 10<sup>th</sup> June 2022.
- 25% concession from 11<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> June 2022.

Some seats are reserved for candidates with outstanding academic record, Sports Persons and differently abled persons.

## ATTENDANCE

All students are required to attend all the Lectures, tutorials, practical sessions, extension Lectures and other programmes arranged for them. A student whose attendance falls below 80% will not be allowed to appear Promotion&End Semester examination.

- a) Staying away from college without leave is not tolerated except when the cause is sudden illness or unforeseen circumstances.
- b) No student is allowed to go away from the college during college hours without approval from Principal/Vice Principal.
- c) To be admitted to the classroom those who have been absent must show their teacher the 'Regularity Record' duly countersigned by the Principal/ Vice Principal/ Dean Students Welfare

## EXAMINATIONS

It is compulsory for all the students to sit for Internal Assessment and Mid Term Examination for Degree and Higher Secondary. Students failing in Internal Assessment and Mid-Term Examination cannot sit for End Semester or Promotion Examination. Progress report will be sent to the parents to appraise them of the progress of their children.

## GENERAL DISCIPLINE

1. Students are required to maintain discipline and good conduct within the campus.
2. Dress and general appearance must be in good taste. It is compulsory for all the students to wear College Uniform.
3. Smoking, chewing of pan/pan masala, and Drug, Alcohol and mobile use is strictly prohibited within the campus.



4. Communal harmony is to be preserved in words and deeds.
5. Fomenting agitation, damaging and dirtying of the College property should be strictly avoided or may have to be compensated.
6. Each student must have a college identity card and a fee coupon. The identify card and leave record book is to be brought to the college everyday and is to be produced when asked for.
7. Students wishing to take a transfer certificate during the year have to clear all the college dues up to the end of the current academic year.
8. Fees once paid are not refundable.
9. All terms and conditions set forth in this Prospectus, including fees and dues etc., are liable to be revised whenever necessary.

## FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE

### COLLEGE DATA MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (CDMS)

To simplify college management the college had signed an MOU in May 2017 with SIMS LITE. Through this software system, the management of admission, attendance academic assessment, co- curricular activities , parents- teacher interaction etc for the college become easier and informative. The college sign a fresh MOU with Ramitech this year for college management software.

### HOSTEL

Secure and separate hostel accommodation for boys and girls are available for deserving students on first come first serve basis. Seats in the hostel are allotted at the time of admission. There are 70 seat for Boys and 70 seat for Girls. However, admission into the College does not bestow any guarantee or right for hostel admission. Separate rules for the hostels may be obtained on request from the office or from the hostel warden. Admission in the hostel is strictly at the discretion of the Principal.

### BUS SERVICE

The college provides daily bus service for desiring students who are residing in and around PR Hill, Kohima Town, High school junction, New Sect, Kohima College and DBS Junction . Constant Taxi service (share or hire) is also available at North Police point.

### COMPUTER CENTRE

To update the knowledge of the staff and the students and keep abreast of the changing World in the field of Information Technology, the College has set up a Computer Centre. The College in alliance with the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELET), Kohima is offering Course on Computer Concept (CCC)

# DIFFERENT CLUBS AND ORGANISATION

## EVANGELICAL UNION

In order to fulfill the objective, student volunteers and programme functionaries are engaged in constructive and productive programmes involving students in various awareness drives, social reforms, communal harmony, creation of community assets, relief work, blood donation and environmental protection.

# **Students Affairs and Awards**

## **ATTENDANCE AWARD**

Top three students maintaining the highest percentage of attendance in each class are eligible for the award. It carries certificate and cash incentives.

## **MERITORIOUS AWARD**

Meritorious Award is given to those students who secure First position with First Division marks, and aggregate of Terminal and Selection Examination in their respective classes. The Award carries a memento and cash incentives.

## **AWARD OF EXCELLENCE**

Students securing Topper or highest mark in a particular subject in HSSLC and Degree Examination are eligible for the Award. It carries cash award and citation.

## **COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP**

BA and B.com 1st students securing 75% in HSSLC examination can apply college scholarship. 5 student's each in BA and B.com 1<sup>st</sup> Semester can avail college scholarship and the selection will be based on merit. Selected students will get 50% free tuition fee in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester and it will continue in subsequent semester if the student secure 1<sup>st</sup> class in the End semester Examination.

## **SPECIAL CATEGORY STUDENTS SCHOLARSHIP**

Special category students scholarship is being introduced in (2016) for the degree students, one each for BA & B.Com. The main objective of the scholarship is to provide an opportunity to students from poor economic background, who has an aptitude for good academic performance,



with academic record of minimum 75% in HSSLC examination. The scholarship covers 50% concession on admission fee and free tuition fees. The scholarship is duly sponsored by the college teaching and non-teaching staff.

## SKILL FEST

Empowering the youth to be sustainable and productive by taking the hidden potential of our younger generation and bridge them with the available resources of the state is the core issue of the Skill Fest.
